The Burgess Hill Creative Community (BHCC) formed in the summer of 2023. We took over the Kiln with the hope we could build on the initiative and vision Burgess Hill Shed began. Our aim is to enable members of our local community to access affordable arts and crafts activities and provide a safe and sociable environment for people to come together and share their skills.

A Registered Charity

BHCC is a registered charity which means we operate and manage our purpose in a responsible way, we have certain rules and regulations to enable us all to be safe and happy taking part in our arts and crafts activities. As a registered charity we are able to support our aims and objectives through raising funds, applying for grants and from donations.

Burgess Hill Creative Community Objectives

Burgess Hill Creative Community benefits the local community by providing access to social, affordable creative art and crafting activities in a safe environment.

We aim to

- Provide ways for members to reduce social isolation, alleviate loneliness, and improve general wellbeing through access to creative activities which might otherwise be inaccessible to many.
- Increase public exposure to, and involvement in, hand-based creative and craft activities in Burgess Hill and the surrounding area, to broaden the idea of arts and cultural participation for individuals from a wide range of backgrounds and abilities.
- Promote equal opportunities to members, encouraging inclusivity and respect for a diverse range of values, opinions and cultural differences.
- Strengthen and build community capacity, encouraging members to be proactive in participating in local economic and social regeneration.
- Serve as a non-profit community organisation that operates for the public benefit and contributes to the wider society through charitable activities and initiatives.

Members Rights

As a member you have voting rights on the election of trustees and major decisions affecting the BHCC. You can attend the Annual General Meeting where you can provide ideas, raise issues and discuss what affects you and the BHCC.

BHCC Rules

- Please do sign in and out every time you attend The Kiln, for our Fire Safety regulations.
- Please make yourself aware of the emergency exits located in the building and external meeting point, you will be shown on your induction after you join. Familiarise yourself with the location of emergency power off buttons, safety switches, first aid kits, fire extinguishers and fire alarms. In case of emergency or when alarm sounds follow the procedure as set out at The Kiln.
- Follow all health and safety guidance and procedures and always wear PPE where appropriate.
- You must be competent in the use of any of the equipment used.
- Report any accidents to the session supervisor and ensure a record is made in the accident book.

- Remember you are sharing the space with other members and guests. Please be mindful of individual needs and respect our members differences.
- Please ensure there is always somebody else in the building with you at all times. Always be aware of others members safety.
